Ongoing COVID Situation

Thanks to everyone for your support as we navigated our way through COVID.

Health authorities are advising us to treat COVID like any communicable disease, with several outbreaks a year forecast. It is becoming increasingly clear that the onus is on each of us as individuals to monitor and manage our own health and well-being, making personal decisions as to what levels of risk we are prepared to take. As a club it is incumbent upon us to manage this risk as best we can for our members and visitors

At our recent Board meeting we reviewed the situation in light of this information and have developed the following draft policy for how we deal with the ongoing situation.

1. Throughout the Year

- Remind members of the need to be careful and monitor their own health as well as considering the needs and well-being of fellow members.
- Advise members who are feeling unwell not to attend the club and seek medical help if Necessary.
- Offer support to members who develop COVID and don't have local support.

2. When an outbreak of COVID is Identified, but there is no change to the advice given by Bowls Australia and/or the Federal &/or State governments

- Provide masks for people who have forgotten one and wish to wear a mask
- Provide hand sanitiser in appropriate places
- Put in place basic social distancing and reduced seating with no more than 6 people to a table in the clubhouse
- Encourage social distancing outside where possible.
- Review the viability of upcoming events and whether they should be cancelled, postponed
 or their format modified to ensure the health and well-being of volunteers, members and
 guests.
- Keep members updated on the evolving situation.

3. Long Term

- The Tournament Committee will meet at the end of the season and discuss issues and give feedback to The Board on a range of issues including how best to manage the impact of potential COVID outbreaks in the future in the best manner possible.
- Review the events which we put on throughout the year, including Tournaments, Friday
 Night Teas and Club Events and develop guidelines for what to do when COVID outbreaks
 occur.

We would appreciate your feedback on the above so that we are able to continue to move forward as a club, keeping our members as safe as possible, whilst finding a way to keep things as normal as possible.





Many of Tony's immediate and extended family made the trip over from around the country and I know he loved catching up with them. It was great to see so many club members attending the celebrations with him.






























Spotters Fee







SAFETY MATTERS - STAY HEALTHY IN THE HEAT

With several incidents already recorded this season, it is timely to remind everyone to stay hydrated. Talk to your doctors about the effects of blood pressure medication, diuretics, and benefits of hydralite supplements. Staying hydrated and alert can affect game performance, especially in the last half of a game.

If that happens to you, you may not be drinking enough water.
