We are also reviewing our induction processes for new members and volunteers who help around the club and once these have been finalised will be advising members of any changes and enhancements to our current processes.

The sub-committee who have been looking into the situation regarding A5 Green have been gathering further information on the precise issues with the green, seeking expert advice and once we have finalised recommendations on the possible way forward we will be contacting members to arrange a special general meeting at which these recommendations can be discussed, opinions aired and decisions made as to how we best manage the situation. This is likely to be early in the new bowling season.

As many of you may be aware we are stil experiencing issues related to the changes to our club telephone system. I would like to acknowledge all the hard work that Bill May has put into getting our new system working. We are hoping that the initial teething problems can be ironed out over the next few weeks so that it is fit for purpose and up and running well before the new season.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT Continued





The purpose of the Obelisk was to store rockets which would be fired to the ship. The rockets contained life lines and baskets for bringing passengers ashore.

The other amazing thing at this site is the evidence of nature at work, eroding the limestone cliffs, so much so that eventually the Obelisk will sink into the sea.

Much more to see yet in this interesting part of SA.






